

## Pastor's Thoughts





everyone on your list? Or is there that one person that seems to have it all that has you in a bind? This week several ministry emails I received talked about gift giving and how it seems that the Christ part of Christmas has been swap out for "giftmas". As a person who not only enjoys receiving gifts, but also giving people gifts this is a tricky line to walk especially as a pastor. My loved ones know that I am always listening for clues on the "right gift" and that all year round I look for those good deals. In a way I want to embody the cliché "its the thought that counts". I want to put so much thought and love into a gift that the person receiving it knows that they are cared for deeply. As I meditated on this idea of gift giving, I noticed a beautiful display that my godparents gave me a few years back called "The Gifts of the Magi". This display has three small ornate boxes each of a different design, and within each box is one of the gifts the Wise men brought. Let us look briefly at the account as recorded in Matthew 2:9–11.

After listening to the king, they went on their way. And behold, the star that they had seen when it rose went before them until it came to rest over the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy. And going into the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshiped him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh. (ESV)

The wise men who had traveled a great distance to find one who had been "born king of the Jews", have finally reached their destination. Coming to the house these foreign dignitaries, who mostly likely served in the court of another king, now bow and worship the infant Jesus. As if this puzzling picture is not strange enough, these eastern stargazers take out treasures to offer the perhaps just months old king; gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Do any of these gifts sound very practical to you?

Lets puzzle over these gifts for a moment beginning with gold. Gold is surely a treasured item. It is rare and dazzling. Not unlike today, gold was highly valued and so was present in the wealthiest of treasuries. Barclay writes, "And gold, the king of metals, is the fit gift for a king of men." (William Barclay, The Daily Study Bible, "The Gospel of Matthew vol.1" pg.32) It stands to reason that if you were going to worship a king, even an infant one, then gold was the right kind of gift to bring.

The second gift as frankincense is a bit more unusual. Frankincense was the hardened sap of a particular tree. This crystalized sap was quite fragrant and was crushed up to make perfumes, medicine, and incense. Interestingly, if you were to look at Exodus 30:34-38 you would find that the Lord directs the incense for the Tabernacle to be made with an equal part of – you guessed it – frankincense. Again look at what Barcaly writes, "Frankincense is the gift for a priest....The priest is the man who builds a bridge between men and God." (IBID, pg 32) Could these foreign wise men possibly understand the significance this gift would mean?

The final gift of the three is myrrh. Myrrh is similar to frankincense in that it is also derived from the sap of a tree. This sap came from a small thorny tree and was used as a spice, medicine, or cosmetic. Barclay notes that myrrh as a spice played a significant role in the embalming process, "Myrrh is the gift for one who is to die." (Ibid, 32) Myrrh is not exactly the kind of gift one might think appropriate for a king or a baby. Look at this list again; gold for a king, frankincense for a priest, and myrrh for one who is destined to die. All of a sudden this three gifts don't seem so strange. Jesus was born to be the King of kings. He was to become the great high priest. Ultimately his life would take him to the cross and the grave for our sins and shame.

What gift would you bring to baby Jesus? Let me present two verses to help you answer this question as we go into Christmas and the New Year. The first is found in Hosea 6:6, "For I desire steadfast love and not sacrifice, the knowledge of God rather than burnt offerings." (ESV) The second from Romans 12:1, "I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship." (ESV) In both of these verses God reveals the gift he desires most, and the answer is you. God wants to be in relationship with you. He wants your heart, mind, body, and soul – simply put all of you. The wise men were wise enough to know that in the presence of little Lord Jesus they needed to bow down, worship, and offer fine gifts. Will we be wise enough to heed the Word of God and to offer ourselves completely to the Almighty King, the great High Priest, and the one who died to save our souls? Let us begin this New Year by affirming and growing in our relationship with the Lord, and if you have not committed to following Jesus it is not too late to start today. All you have to do is pray to God and ask Jesus to be Lord of your life and King of your heart.
