In last month's newsletter I shared the distinct vision that guides the ministry of Bluff Hall Church. As a church we want to be "Growing in Christ – Sharing His Love". On top



of this we have values that we as a church find important, these we have expressed as our core values. The focus of this article will be our first core value of "Biblical Teaching". The statement reads, "Biblical teaching leads believers to a life change found only in Jesus Christ." While so much more could be said about the importance of teaching the Bible our focus is on the power of the Word of God to transform the hearts and minds of those who hear and receive it. Thinking on the transformational power of the Word brought a passage from the Prophet Ezekiel to my mind, let me share it with you.

The hand of the LORD was upon me, and he brought me out in the Spirit of the LORD and set me down in the middle of the valley; it was full of bones. And he led me around among them, and behold, there were very many on the surface of the valley, and behold, they were very dry. And he said to me, "Son of man, can these bones live?" And I answered, "O Lord GOD, you know." Then he said to me, "Prophesy over these bones, and say to them, O dry bones, hear the word of the LORD. Thus says the Lord GOD to these bones: Behold, I will cause breath to enter you, and you shall live. And I will lay sinews upon you, and will cause flesh to come upon you, and cover you with skin, and put breath in you, and you shall live, and you shall know that I am the LORD." So I prophesied as I was commanded. And as I prophesied, there was a sound, and behold, a rattling, and the bones came together, bone to its bone. And I looked, and behold, there were sinews on them, and flesh had come upon them, and skin had covered them. But there was no breath in them. Then he said to me, "Prophesy to the breath; prophesy, son of man, and say to the breath, Thus says the Lord GOD: Come from the four winds, O breath, and breathe on these slain, that they may live." So I prophesied as he commanded me, and the breath came into them, and they lived and stood on their feet, an exceedingly great army. (Ezekiel 37:1–10 ESV)

Wow! Can you imagine seeing such a stirring vision? The Lord explains to His prophet that these "dry bones" are the people of Israel. They have perished and lost hope in the Lord their God. Although the vision does not detail the reason behind the perishing of the people, I wonder if it has to do with God's Word. We know that the Lord often sent the prophets to remind Israel about the Word of God and to call them back to faithful obedience. You see when the people of God disconnect from His Word they find themselves suffering starvation. They begin to do things the way they want and in all honesty they make a great big mess (for proof of this see the book of Judges). The word of God has the ability to breathe life into the things that are dead. It can bring hope to the hopeless and strength to the powerless. In Hebrews we just learned that the Word of God is sharper than any two-edged sword, and is able to pierce through lies and deception.

At Bluff Hall the Word of God is central in all that we do. On a Sunday morning our service incorporates many instances of the Word, with the primary focus being on the study of the Bible. Over the last nine and half years through our weekly sermon time we have together studied 34 of the 66 books of the Old Testament and New Testament in their entirety. Through our Christian Education programs we have also learned more about the Word of God. Likewise our children have been instructed in the Word of God as we seek to help them know and love Jesus. Yet, this core value is not just held within the church, every Sunday I see people bringing their own Bible to worship. I hear of how the Word spoke to various individuals as they read it throughout the week. It is my prayer that the people of Bluff Hall would hunger and thirst for the Word of the Lord, that you would remain connected to it and avoid becoming a valley of dry bones separated from God.

Highlights of Annual Meeting - February 2, 2025

2024 Summary: Income: \$95,824.29 Expenses: \$92,487.32 Year-End gain of \$3,336.97

Balances: Checkbook: \$20,198.46, Memorial Fund: \$14,538.74,

Savings Account: \$15,400.55 (includes money earmarked for the building Fund)

CD's: Memorial Fund \$75,000.00, Building Fund \$10,339.33 and Special Family Tithe \$144,804.00.

Audit of the Treasurer's Records for 2024 will be conducted after the annual meeting.

Annual reports from all officers and groups were given and approved per Annual Meeting booklet.

A motion was passed that all entities submit financial reports to be included in the Annual Meeting Booklet in the future.

StarLink Internet has been installed. Memorial Fund money approved to pay the monthly \$140 fee for this fiscal year.

Use for special family tithe was discussed. Currently money is in a CD and will remain in the CD until needed use is determined and approved. Any interest earned will be reinvested in the CD.

Cabin repairs are needed and associated cost as well as long term plan for the cabin will be discussed between trustees and cabin donors. Records will be researched for history of any previous cabin agreements.

Memorial Fund CD is due next month and accrued interest goes into the general fund. Motion made to reinvest CD at best available interest rate.

Nominating Committee Report was approved as presented in the Annual Meeting Booklet.


Individual groups and boards reminded to meet soon to elect officers and appoint their Church Council representative. This information to be given to Debbie Dodd, clerk.
